- an annual awards ceremony (usually in conjunction with the research conference) that highlights the work of criminal justice students, educators, and practitioners;
 - a network for all members to discuss issues and disseminate information related to criminal justice education; and
 - an online journal for scholarly presentation of knowledge relevant to criminal justice.
